From John

My daddy wore shiny pants. At least that's what he said. Not to me.

He was in a group of people, and they were talking about the past and raising children. He said that there were times he went so long between buying new pants that the seat of his pants would be worn so thin that they were so shiny that he would be afraid to walk away from people.

I didn't really remember that at first. Growing up I didn't really think anything much about what my dad wore. It was the same dark pants and white, laundered shits with starched collars and tie that everybody's dad seemed to wear to work. With a suit or sport coat available for when he went out on assignment to take pictures for the *Nashville Banner*. He also spent many, many hours in the dark room (if you are under twenty ask me later what a dark room is). He also had a dress hat that he often wore – just like all other men.

But as I thought about it, I think maybe I do remember shiny pants. Or maybe that's just my guilt. Because I know he sacrificed a lot to raise me and my three sisters. As did my mother. It couldn't have been easy to make ends meet. Mother stretched meals and clothes. And daddy found other jobs to make a little extra. As did my stay-at-home mom (as were almost all moms back then).

So they sacrificed for their children. I didn't realize it back then. We seemed to have what most everybody else had. And they made sure we did fun things and school things. It was a wonderful way to grow up. We were loved.

And it was that love that made them sacrifice for us. I know that now because I am a dad and a granddad. And I have occasionally sacrificed for my children. Because I love them. I like to think that makes my dad and mom smile in heaven.

And my small sacrifices are as nothing compared to what I see from Gloria and her mom. Wow. They are sacrificers extraordinaire and women of love. I am constantly humbled by the example of their sacrificial love.

We all gladly sacrifice for those we love, don't we? God did. Sent His Son. In love.

And His Son sacrificed because of love. All the way to the cross. Not just a sacrifice of things. A sacrifice of everything.

And we are supposed to imitate Him. Follow Him. Take up our cross and follow Him.

So during Lent you could learn from my dad and his shiny pants. But you really should learn from Jesus. Should follow Him. To the cross.

In so doing you let your life "so shine". Shine before all that they, too, will glorify God. (Matthew 5:16) Love and sacrifice. Just something to think about during Lent.

For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. (John 3.16 NRSV)

A young husband has a crippling, terminal neurological disease. His wife is carrying a baby which this unfortunate young man may never live to see. Thus he writes a letter to this unborn child to say something very important that is on his heart. Listen carefully as you read these words. They are very beautiful. Remember he is writing to his unborn child:

"Your mother is very special," he writes. "Few men know what it is like to receive appreciation for taking their wives out to dinner when it entails what it does for us. It means that she has to dress me, shave me, brush my teeth, comb my hair, wheel me out of the house and down the steps, open the garage and put me in the car, take the pedals off the chair, stand me up, sit me in the seat of the car, twist me around so that I am comfortable, fold the wheelchair, put it in the car, go around to the other side of the car, start it up, back it out, get out of the car, pull the garage door down, get back into the car, drive off to the restaurant. And then, it starts all over again. She gets out of the car, unfolds the wheelchair, opens the door, spins me around, stands me up, seats me in the wheelchair, pushes the pedals out, closes and locks the car, wheels me into the restaurant, then takes the pedals off the wheelchair so I won't be uncomfortable. We sit down to have dinner, and she feeds me throughout the entire meal. And when it's over she pays the bill, pushes the wheelchair out to the car again, and repeats the same routine. And when it's over, finished, with real warmth, she'll say, 'Honey, thank you for taking me out to dinner.' I never quite know what to answer. . ."

If you have ever been the target of unconditional love, you know that young man's predicament. If you ever get a grasp on all Christ has done in your behalf, you understand the uncertainty of this young husband with this tragic neurological disease. You simply do not know what to say. You and I are the recipients of an amazing self-giving love.

Dear God, thank you for your self-giving love. In Jesus name, Amen.
