On my way to Scottsboro. 45 minute drive. Radio? No. I need the quiet of riding in the car alone.

Wait. Maybe not alone. A great opportunity to spend time with God. Let's see if I can see Him anywhere.

The side of the interstate. October in Alabama. I look at the maple leaves. And then the oak. Color differences. You and I would have never thought of that. Subtle colors and shapes. That shout the greatness of God. The green of Alabama cedars. Might make a good Christmas tree. God thought of trees that change color and trees that stay green. I see Him here.

Beautiful blue sky. Big, puffy clouds. A song lyric from a youth musical – "cotton candy clouds so fluffy and white. Who put you there in the sky so blue? Or do you just happen to float along?" No. God put 'em there. He thought that up. Thank you God for your sky.

Down the ramp off the interstate. Up the mountain. Look at the limestone cliffs. God made limestone. Great for having caves. Great for making mountains. And crumbling into rocks for driveways and little boys to throw. Thank you for rocks and mountains.

Small towns. Where everybody knows your name. Little churches. With signs. And crosses. Places that want you to know they see God every day, too.

Top of the mountain in Section. Pull over and look into the Tennessee Valley. The volume just went up. Shouting God's presence. Kind of makes you gasp at the beauty. How could anybody look off this mountain and not see God? The river reflecting the afternoon light off the wind blown surface. A golden glow. Mountains and hills going down into the river. Covered in green. And fall colors. Boats cutting white wakes on the river. Stop. Be quiet. He is here. You can see His fingerprints everywhere.

Back on the road and down Sand Mountain. Across the river. In the shallows lots of growth in the water. And over there is a cluster of egrets. Leaning their white heads down to hunt for a late fish lunch. One lifts its wings and begins to fly. God made that bird. I slow down to watch the bird. And I tell God how great He is. And I wonder. "When you made this world did you know I would sit here one day and praise you?" Too deep to wonder. I just drink it in while I enjoy your birds. Forty five minutes with God. And all He made. What could be better than this?

I pull into the parking lot where I am meeting my son, Joseph. We get out and hug each other. And it is a lot better than the view. God gave me this son. And I love him. And I love God for giving Gloria and I such a gift. Our sons. Thank you, God. It is really easy to see you when I look at Joseph or his brothers.

Thank you for the gifts of our four sons. And for the gift of Your Son. You only had one. And you gave Him to us. Now that is God speaking to us.

And He wants to speak to you. You might try it the next time you have a 45 minute drive. Or you could just listen to the radio. But remember, at the Thanksgiving table somebody is going to ask you what you are thankful for. You could get ready for that question now.

Recently our pastor asked us, "Would you be willing to tell of a time when someone in our church offered encouragement to you? It was not the first time he's asked us to respond in morning worship in this or some similar way, and it is always meaningful. Frequently, I have said a few words. However, this particular Sunday I was flooded with memories of times when I have been encouraged by so many of you. In the many years we have been part of the Collinsville Baptist Church family, you have walked beside us, sharing our burdens, multiplying our joys.

Some of you were here when Morgan babies were born, when our sons went through kindergarten Graduation and elementary sports, children's choir programs and church youth musicals. You were our family when our extended family could not be here. Some of you had a part in elementary and high school classes, or taught Sunday School. There were high school sports and band and proms and graduations, their college allegiances, graduations, even weddings. You have always been encouragers, even in the years since as sons have pursued various careers. We are so grateful.

Perhaps some of you remember years ago when the pastorium burned. The church, and our whole community, could not have been more supportive, caring, compassionate. You assisted in so many practical ways, as well. Your generosity was overwhelming. Then later, you helped make it possible for us to have a home of our own. You moved walls, sheet rocked, redid stairs and closets and rebuilt bathrooms, caulked and painted and helped with heating and cooling, flooring. You were amazing, and we are still so grateful.

There have been other times of heart ache, disappointment, sorrow, and you have been ready to walk with us through those times, as well, including the sudden death of my father on his sixtieth birthday years ago, the death of my husband's parents, and the years of care giving and death of my mother nine months ago. You lavished your love upon us, and it was such an encouragement.

You have shared calls and cards and food and gifts at Easter, Thanksgiving, Christmas, other holidays and ordinary days. You have sometimes blessed us with anticipating our needs — even before we realized we had them. You have volunteered for things at church or offered other kinds of assistance. Sometimes you have shared encouragement from the wealth of your experience, or offered a Scripture that was meaningful to you and ministered to us.

Is it any wonder that I might have trouble telling of a time when someone in our church offered me encouragement? What a blessing you have been. What encouragers you are! God has been so good to give us you as our church family. Thank you for your continuing prayers and encouragement.


