

"Have the daffodils already come and gone?" I asked my wife.

"Yes, Honey, they've already come and gone." She sweetly replied. As a flower lover to a person who was not sure if her daffodils had bloomed. In spite of the lines of yellow flowers on both sides of the front sidewalk. Now just green stems.

The question came about because of a picture our son Matthew texted from his back yard in Connecticut. It was still covered in snow. There were a few pitiful sprigs of green sticking through the white snow. He said that he hoped this was a sign of spring.

So I decided to send him a picture of what he was missing back in his home state. I went and snapped a picture or two of flowers around town. Then I thought that he and his two kids would like to see something from our house. And I thought, what better to show spring is coming than daffodils by the sidewalk. Oops.

I looked on around the yard. And then I saw it. The sign that always tells me that spring is coming. Next to out garage. A Redbud tree in all its glory. Its beautiful pinkish purple blooms up and down its branches. The blooms highlighted by the white wall of the garage.

Redbuds have those blooms while all the other trees are still completely bare, their branches black against the sky as if reaching out for a little sunlight. You see that pinksh color splattered all around Lookout Mountain. Still no green, no leaves. Just the pink flowers shouting, "Spring is coming". I know that means that in a week and a half, the Dogwoods will be white and the trees will have new green leaves on their now bare branches.

My parents loved Dogwoods. Me, too. But it is the Redbuds that really herald spring. Dogwoods are just the proof that the Redbuds were right.

So I snapped a few shots and texted them to Matthew. Hey, up there in frozen New England. Quit looking at your slushy snow. This is what spring looks like in Alabama.

I like the changing of the seasons. Spring flowers, summer heat, fall leaves, winter cold. I like them all. But always thoughts of what's next. I get tired of the heat here in the summer. If I lived in New England I would get tired of the snow. But mostly I just enjoy what is and what's next.

The Redbuds tell us what's next. Like the fall leaves falling. They remind us of cycles in this world. And in our lives. Each season of Redbuds means my birthday is almost here, and I will be a year older. A reminder of life's cycle – birth, teens, married, children, grandchildren, old age, death. A cycle that cannot be broken. We live, we grow, we die. Can be kind of depressing.

Most religions recognize this unending cycle. Death awaits everyone. You see hints of that in Ecclesiastes. "There is nothing new under the sun. It is all vanity. All empty."

But we Christians believe there is something new under the sun. Oh, we celebrate Easter this time of year. Redbuds and Easter baskets. Marshmallow bunnies. Jelly Beans.

But most importantly we celebrate new life. That the cycle is broken. That Jesus brought something new to us. Life.

On Good Friday, Satan cackled as Jesus died. "I win," he must have said. "Death had come even to God's Son." But by Easter morning there was a new message for Satan. "You lost." Jesus won the victory. The cycle of death is broken. Jesus is alive. And so am I because I follow Jesus. I will live with him forever. How do I know? The empty tomb. Redbuds assure me that spring is here yet again.

The empty tomb tells me that the cycle, the curse of death is broken. It is finished. The battle is over. And Jesus is Lord. *Death has been swallowed up in victory...The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. I Corinthians 15.*
