

Muldoon. It's a game.

You probably never played it.

In the game, everybody gets a sheet of paper numbered 1 to 10. Somebody picks ten cards out of a stack. Each card has a question. Read the questions aloud. Each player writes down their answer. Turn in your papers. Someone reads the papers out loud one at a time. Then everybody tries to guess who wrote those answers. The purpose is to get to know each other – to learn new things about one another. That's because the questions are things like: What's your favorite flavor of ice cream? Where were you born? What's your favorite team? How many sisters do you have? Have you been to another country?

Our church group was on its way to Yellowstone Park for a mission trip. We would be working in the park and in a local community. It is a long, long drive from here to Yellowstone. Muldoon helped us to use our time better.

One day we were driving across Montana. Sun shining. Four hours from our destination. We decided to play another round. The second question in this game of Muldoon was: *What do you see?*

I laughed out loud. I knew everybody would have the same answer. We were on the interstate between Billings and Bozeman. On our right to the north were National Forests and mountains. But it was the view on the left that had everybody's attention. The Yellowstone River was almost out of its banks. The water was filled with white caps with spray in the air. Sunlight glinting. Just across the river, the green fields where the deer and the antelope played. And beyond the fields the snow capped peaks rose up and filled the sky. The water we saw in the river had melted off those mountains a day or two before. It was a stunningly beautiful view. Everything seemed to be shouting at you to look. It was hard for me to keep my attention on the road as I drove.

So I smiled as I wrote the obvious answer. *What do you see*? I needed several pages of paper to answer, but I only had one line on the paper. All I could fit in the blank on my paper was – *mountains and river*. The same as everybody else would answer.

We turned in our papers. Somebody began reading the answers. Sure enough, each paper had some version of my answer – *what do you see? Mountains and river*.

Until we got near the end. What do you see? The answer on this paper? The people. That person saw the people in the van. Not the view. Not the river and the mountains. What kind of weird person does that? Gloria. She saw the people while I saw the view.

Is there a lesson? One lesson is that we were both right. For me the view was great and shouted God's presence. For Gloria the people were great and shouted God's presence.

God makes us different. And gifts us differently. If you go on a trip with us, you probably will want me to get us there. Gloria would tell you quickly that she would hate to do all the driving and the planning and watching over the details of any trip, much less one to the other side of the country. But I would tell you that you would enjoy the trip more with Gloria. She would give you lots of loving care. She might not know where she was, but she would know what you needed. You need me to get you there. You need Gloria to enjoy the trip.

That's how the church is supposed to work. Different gifts to different people. When all Christians are doing what God made them to do and gifted them to do, it is amazing what can happen. We really are the body of Christ at that point. June 4 is Pentecost. The birthday of the church. When the Holy Spirit came on all believers. And all believers received a gift. Or gifts.

There is a second lesson. It is that Gloria was right. The church works best when it never forgets it is about Jesus and about people. We were not in Montana to see mountains. We were there to see people. And tell them about Jesus.

Jesus went to lots of towns and villages and cities. Where the people were. To tell them about the Kingdom of God. Just before He left this world, he went up another mountain. And told Christians to go tell people, to make disciples. Don't forget to tell people about Jesus. In Montana. And Alabama. Everywhere to everybody. A church must never forget that. Or you and I. Jesus. People.
